

Ernest Andrews Dies Here at 81

Ernest Andrews, 81, a resident of Fort Collins and Estes Park at various times, died at the Larimer County Hospital Sunday afternoon after a long illness. Since returning here in 192 from Estes Park, his home had been at 323 South Shields Street.

Coming here in 1909 from Missouri, Mr. Andrews first worked as a cigar maker for John Griffith. Later he operated a small store at Mountain and College Avenues, and in June, 1922, moved to Estes Park where he was employed as a school custodian from 1925 to 1945.

Mr. Andrews was born April 19, 1872, at Canton, Ill., and on Aug. 15, 1890 at Clayton, Mo., married the former Miss Flora M. Stanton, who survives. Their children are Mrs. W. Ed Wright of Fort Collins and Mrs. Stella M. Paxton of Fresno, Calif. There are four grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

A sister is Mrs. Ruth E. Snively of La Crescenta, Calif.; and a brother is Henry V. Andrews of Glendale, Calif.

Mr. Andrews was a member of the Collins Masonic Lodge here and of Odd Fellows and Woodmen's Lodges.

A Masonic graveside service at Grandview cemetery is planned at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday. Friends may view the body at the Rice-Warren mortuary from 2 to 7 p.m. Tuesday.
